Synopsis

WAITING FOR RAIN

The production is premised on the idea of rain symbolising rebirth, new life and a release of both artistic and emotional energy, an apt theme as Jazzart celebrated it's 40th anniversary.

BROTHERHOOD

We have flown the air like birds and swum the sea like fishes, but have yet to learn the simple act of walking the earth like brothers. The universal brotherhood of man is our most precious possession. You earn brotherhood, the purest friendship, trust, love, whatever you want to call it, moment by moment through how you treat others.

BLUES VIR MY MA

A young man laments dysfunctional parenting.

AMOR

"Love", the profound connection between people, especially in how much compassion and affection they can show another person.

GEE MY DIE WOORDE

Adolescent infatuation.

CROSSROAD

Crossroad explores the theme of decision making, and how we as humans purposefully navigate through life. Using movement to create actions

and activities, the dancers turn, spiral and steer through a series of choreographed intersections to find their pathways and moments to support each other through the entwined convergence.

BITTERSOET

Looking into the devastating effect of Cape Town's winter rains, Bittersoet dives into the hardships of navigating township life. The emotional and physical challenges produce both resilience and severe trauma, this bittersweet effect is translated through a lyrical contemporary lens.

3 Dancing souls coalesce to fill the void.


